-> Appellant/petitioner's opening brief, of no more than 35 pages, and excerpts of record shall be served and filed, pursuant to FRAP 31(a) and Circuit Rules 28-3.1 and 31-2;

12/14/95

-> The brief of appellee/respondent, of no more than 35 pages, shall be filed and served, pursuant to FRAP 31(a) and Circuit Rules 28-3.1 and 31-2;

1/16/96


-> The optional appellant/petitioner reply brief, of no more than 15 pages, shall be filed and served within fourteen days of service of the appellee/respondent's brief, pursuant to FRAP 31(a) and Circuit Rules 28-3.1 and 31-2.

FAILURE OF THE APPELLANT TO COMPLY WITH THE TIME SCHEDULE ORDER WILL RESULT IN AUTOMATIC DISMISSAL OF THE APPEAL. CIRCUIT RULE 42-1.
